

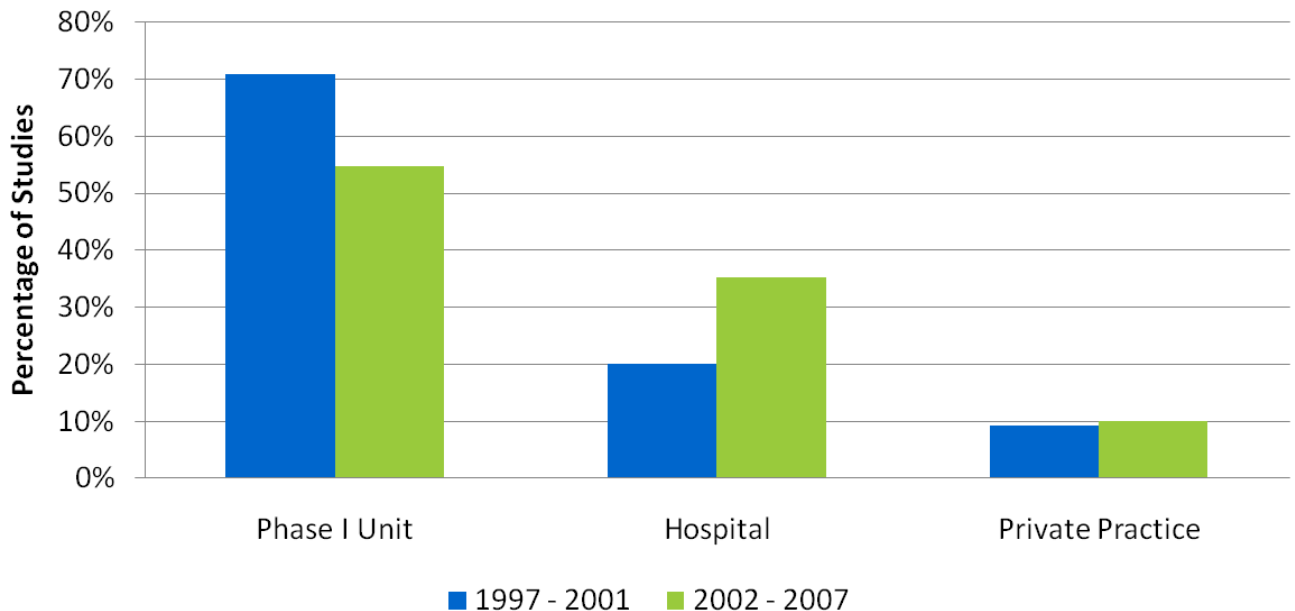
Spotlight on Research Fees: Where Do Phase I Studies Take Place?

The landscape of Phase I facilities has changed dramatically in the last ten years. In the time period from 1997 to 2001, dedicated Phase I units accounted for over 70% of the volume of Phase I studies, compared to 20% for hospitals. The time period between 2002 and 2007 brought a more balanced distribution, with hospitals expanding to 35% of all Phase I studies, and dedicated Phase I units shrinking to 55%. Private practice facilities remained virtually unchanged, accounting for 10% of all studies.
