

Spotlight on Research Fees: Per Subject Fees in Major Metropolitan Areas

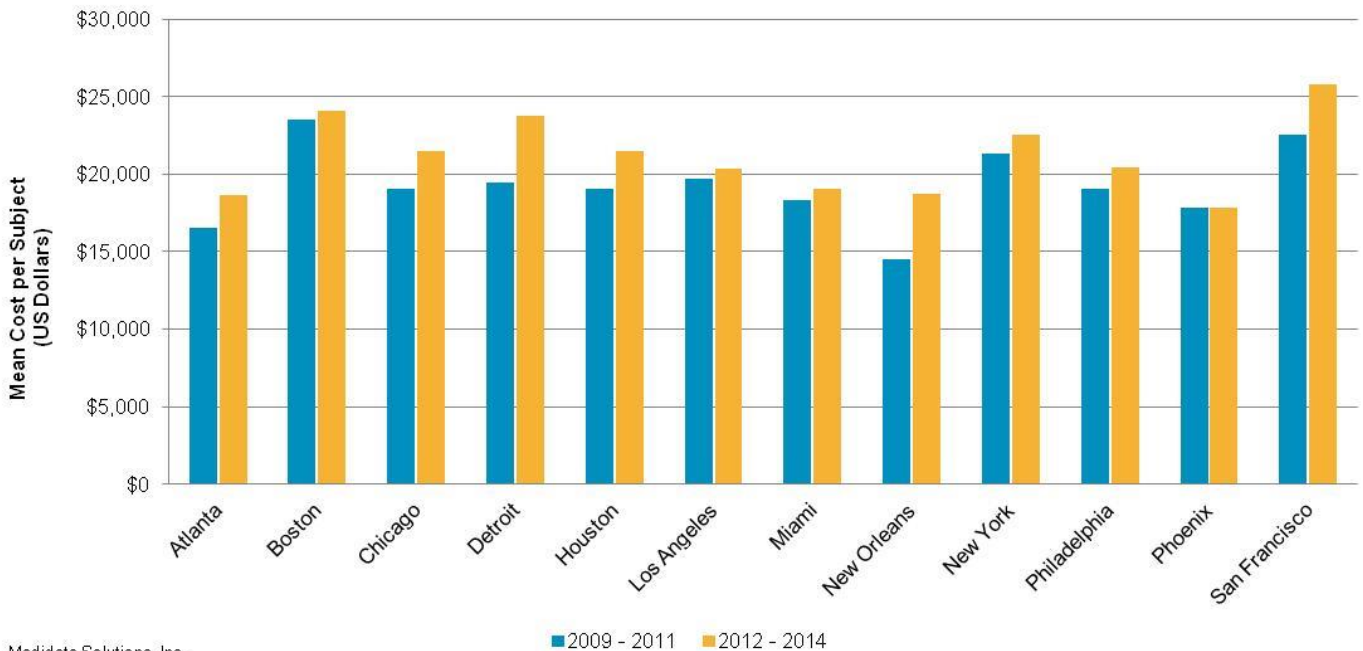
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Per-subject fees vary substantially across major U.S. metropolitan areas. For the period 2012-2014, across all phases and therapeutic areas, the highest average fees were in San Francisco (\$25,758), Boston (\$24,102), and Detroit (\$23,787), while the lowest average fees were in Phoenix (\$17,868), Atlanta (\$18,684), and New Orleans (\$18,738). For the time period 2009-2011 the highest average fees were in Boston (\$23,526) and the lowest average fees were in Atlanta (\$16,509). In both time periods, the highest fees exceeded the lowest fees by over 40%. Some of the variation is due to differences in study mixes.

From the time period of 2009-2011 to the time period of 2012-2014, per-subject fees increased the most in New Orleans (29%), Detroit (22%), and Atlanta (13%), while they increased the least in Phoenix (0%), Boston (2%), and Los Angeles (3%).
